MONDAY:

Galatians 4:1-7

As you consider God's work in you through Christ and His Spirit, what are some of the ways you see His redemption working in your life? In what ways are you tempted to let basic laws rule your heart instead of the Spirit?

TUESDAY:

Leviticus 18:1-5

What do these verses seem to imply regarding the law and salvation? What should happen when we break the commands written in God's law? How are you tempted to think your salvation is based on works?

WEDNESDAY:

Psalms 119:1-8

How do v1-4 impact you as you consider the promises they make in contrast with the lifestyle you live? What hope do v5-8 provide? How are you tempted to think that you can actually accomplish the demands of v1-4?

THURSDAY:

Romans 7:7-25

How is the law holy, righteous, and good? In what ways does the law create the conflict that Paul expresses in v14-21? What hope is there when we find ourselves having broken the law over and over even when we want to keep it?

FRIDAY:

Galatians 4:1-7

What are we to add to redemption and transformation in to these verses? How are you tempted to think that you *can* add something to God's work? What needs to change in your heart to think right about these things?

Matthew 9:32-11:1
